Ryan, Cornelius was a Loyalist
associator in New York
settled in Shelburne, Nova
Scotia, ^{in 1782} with family of 6

Ryan, James was Loyalist from
Maryland who in 1783
moved with his family
of 3 plus 9 servants to
Shelburne, Nova Scotia
where the crown granted
him 50 acres of land, one
town and one water lot;
his losses in consequence of
his loyalty estimated at
£1000

Ryan, John. Went to
St John, New Brunswick at
the peace & was a grantee of
that city. He established a
newspaper called "the St. John
Gazette" which in 1797 was
of small size. Office at
58 Prince William Street. Was
king's printer for the province

Removed to Newfoundland
where he was the Queen's
printer and where he died
in 1847.

Ryan, William. of Pennsylvania
joined the loyalists in 1777
and went with the Royal
Army from Philadelphia to
New York the year following
in 1779 he was officer of
marines on board the
British Privateer "Jeremy"
of New York, was captured
and put in prison in
Philadelphia to be tried for
treason
