

2. 8. O'Rian, John
Massachusetts

Apparently an immigrant born
1735 undoubtedly in Ireland.

He was a private in Captain
Marbury's company as set forth
below from 22 June 1778 to
22 March 1779. Was on the
pension roll of the state of Maine
for \$8 a month on 22 June 1818

He filed a certificate before the
District court of Portland, Maine
on 11 January 1821 stating that
John O'Rian (signed John ^{his} + O'Rian)
resident of Poland, Maine _{mark}. In his
statement of his estate he said
that he had none except one cow
which has been pledged for more
than she is worth. States that
he had been a laborer but cannot

now work due to age, that his wife is now entirely dependent on charity since he has no income. She is age 82

In a different affidavit at the age of 72 he was a resident of Lemington, county of York, citizen of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Service: He states that he passed muster at Pickskill or Fishkill on 22 June 1778 and from thence marched to West Point, from thence to the White Plains and joined Captain Maybury's company in Colonel Tupper's Regiment in General Patterson's Brigade in General Gates Division. He was discharged 22 March 1779

See the file there is a
petition signed by various
citizens of Lemington, ^{County of York, Mass.} stating
that John O'Ryan, a foreigner by
nativity, resident of this town,
is destitute.

This record in Massachusetts is
the last entry in his pension file.

His wife was named Mally.
Lived in Portland, Maine.
