

P 16. Ryan, Harris
Virginia

Harris Ryan on 4 February 1834 claimed a pension as a result of his service in the Revolutionary war as a private soldier. The pension was granted.

He was born 4 November 1764 in Amherst County, Virginia where he resided until the outbreak of the Revolution. He enlisted in 1779 in a company of Virginia foot soldiers under Captain John Morrison in a Regiment under Colonel John Pope. He served for six months. After his discharge he first settled in Wilkes County, Georgia, and then in Campbell County, Tennessee. He later moved to Roane county

in the State of Tennessee
where he was at the time he
claimed his pension in 1834.
In his neighborhood in
Tennessee lived Charles Ryan
who made an affidavit in
support of Harris Ryan's
claim. No relationship to the
claimant is stated however.

In March 1843 his pension
was still being paid. At this
time he lived in McCracken
County, Kentucky and he
stated in his affidavit that
his wife (name not given) had
died and he was living with
his youngest daughter, Unity,
wife of George Brunnet.

No other detail given.
