Initially an inhabitant of Guilford County, later of the State of Tennessee, then Kentucky, then Delaware.

James Ryan was born 25 November 1757 in Guilford County, North Carolina. He stated that he volunteered for service on 21 June 1780 in a company under Captain Assel Brashion. He was at that time a citizen of Guilford County, N.C. He was marched from Guilford Court house to Salisbury where his company joined General Rutherford's Brigade, and later joined General Gates' regular army. Four days before General Gates' defeat at Camden Ryan was taken sick.

Since the end of the
Revolution he lived for ten
years in Tennessee, then
moved to Kentucky where he
lived twenty years. He then
moved to Palestine township,
in the county of Crawford,
Illinois where he was still
located in 1833. He was 76
years of age in 1832.

He received a pension of
\$85. per annum
